# Saying Goodbye (but not really) and Thank You to Two Distinguished Board Members

Two of our most devoted and hard-working board members recently announced they are leaving the MERA Board of Directors. Each has had a tremendous impact on our association.

Henry Robidoux joined the board in 1994 and was President from 2001 – 2007. Two major policies, still in place today, were enacted during his tenure: surviving spouses of employees may continue to be MERA members and membership dues are waived if the employee joins during his or her first year of retirement. While Henry was president, the association reached its peak in membership at 500. He has remained on the board as MERA's first Director Emeritus serving many roles including chairing the trips committee, heading up by-laws oversight and leading nominating efforts. Most recently he has created the MERA Bluebird Trail at Jim Dietrich Park where MERA holds many of its meetings. "As an officer of the company, I felt I had an obligation to support Met-Ed employees even in their retirement!"

Sandy Myskowski is the reason you are reading the MERA Hometown News right now! She introduced the idea of a MERA newsletter in April 2011 and wrote all the issues up to 2020. ### **Changes at FirstEnergy**

FirstEnergy recently announced it is relocating its headquarters from downtown Akron to the company's offices in West Akron as part of an office consolidation plan. The company also announced it's laying off about 90 employees across the company. Another approximately 670 employees will be eligible for a voluntary retirement program. Each employee will decide whether or not to participate. Eligible employees are active non-bargaining employees who are age 55 or older with at least 10 years of service as of Dec. 31, 2023. (Some employee groups, including those involved in day-to-day core operations serving customers, aren't eligible.)
