One of the first things you notice about **Georgine McCool** is what a great last name she has. But what you remember about Georgine is her great laugh and open friendliness.

Georgine is a Berks County native, born in Reading and raised in the Milmont section. She attended Holy Name High School, got her undergraduate at Alvernia and her master's degree at St. Joes and LaSalle. She is the only child of Italian immigrants. Her mother was born in Italy in 1915 and came through Ellis Island. Georgine researched her mother's journey and found the manifest of the actual ship her mother traveled on to the U.S.

She married her husband, Joe (the source of the seriously cool last name) in 1985 and they have two children and five grandchildren.

Georgine worked at Maier's Bakery until the company was sold and then started her career in the IT group at FirstEnergy in 1998. It took a while to get used to working for a large company – all the

# **Electric Utility Scams and Fraud**

As electric utility retirees, we are often considered by friends, family members and neighbors to be experts when it comes to issues related to the electric company. You can help people in your community to battle scams and frauds connected to electric bills by providing these important reminders:

- Met-Ed customers who are behind on their accounts receive written notices of a possible disconnection and how to prevent it. Company representatives will not call or email to demand immediate payment to avoid a same-day shutoff.
- Scammers often use Caller ID spoofing software to misrepresent the source of a phone call to
  further mislead and confuse their targets. Call-back numbers provided by these criminals often
  use greetings and hold messages that mimic legitimate businesses. If someone has any
  doubts about the status of their electric service, they should call Met-Ed using the customer
  service phone number on the website or on their bill to ask about their account.
- While Met-Ed representatives oftentimes make courtesy calls to customers to remind them about an outstanding balance, they would explain how a payment can be made using the established payment options. The company would never require someone to purchase a prepaid money card as the only acceptable means of payment.
- Do not allow anyone claiming to be a utility employee into your home unless you scheduled an appointment and the employee has provided proper identification.
- Met-Ed employees always carry photo identification.
- Met-Ed offers a wide array of approved billing and payment options. Only send payments to Met-Ed and never use a payment account provided by an unknown individual.
