### Met-Ed Retirees Mystery Trip – September 24, 2025 By Denis Dorward

Our annual mystery trip is a day of multiple unknown destinations. An itinerary was handed out, as we entered the bus, listing only the arrival and departure times of each destination. So, we knew our day consisted of a morning destination, buffet lunch, an afternoon destination and a stop for ice cream on the ride home.

The World of Little League Museum, in South Williamsport, was the site of our morning destination. The museum contained interactive exhibits and unique artifacts, including a uniform of the great Babe Ruth. Little League was founded in 1939 by Carl Stotz in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. The first Little League World Series was held in Williamsport in 1947. Over time, Little League evolved to allow girls in 1974 to participate, expanded to more than 80 countries, and now offers various programs beyond the original 8- to 12-year-old division, including a softball division. The stadium complex is located on-site and is where the 8 teams from the U.S. and 8 international teams play all their games to determine the Little League world champion.

Buffet lunch was served at the Genetti Hotel in downtown Williamsport. The Genetti Hotel, originally named the Lycoming Hotel, was built in 1921. The Genetti Hotel's elegant atmosphere has attracted many notable guests and hundreds of celebrity visitors and overnight guests including Gene Kelly, Rita Hayworth, Bob Dylan, Jay Leno and dozens of politicians including Robert Kennedy, Gerald Ford and Tom Ridge. Photographs of these guests are in the hotel hallways. After lunch we boarded the bus and a tour guide provided insight on the city of Williamsport. In the 19th and early 20th centuries, Williamsport was a major lumber hub, flourished by the large Susquehanna log boom, leading to immense wealth for its residents. At one point in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, it had more millionaires per capita than any other place in the world. We drove down West Fourth Street, also

known as Millionaires Row and it's view of the historic homes and splendid Victorian architecture.

The afternoon destination consisted of a paddleboat ride 30 minutes down and back on the Susquehanna River. The weather was perfect, and we all enjoyed the view from the outside top deck. Of course, the trip home included a stop for ice cream at Becky's Soft Serve Ice Cream in Milton, PA.
