Bruce and Maria Balthaser are one of a handful of couples who are both retirees and members of MERA. Between the two of them, they dedicated 62 years to FirstEnergy/Met-Ed in a wide variety of roles. Despite that long history, they did NOT meet on the job. They met at Bruce's cousin's wedding. That was 39 years, three kids, eight grandkids and three great grandkids ago!

When Bruce retired in 2018, he was a line supervisor in Reading, but he'd also worked in the line shops in Hamburg and Easton. Prior to joining the line organization, he worked with industrial clients in Energy Services and managed the Good Cents program which worked to encourage new homeowners to build all electric homes. "That was probably my favorite role. People were happy and excited about building a new home." Bruce graduated from Penn State with a degree in electrical engineering in 1980. Before joining the electric company in 1984, he was a supervisor at several local manufacturing facilities. He received his Professional Engineer license in 1992.

Maria's first job, after graduating from Penn State in 1985 with a Business Administration degree, was as a probation/parole officer for six years. "This was good training for my work at FirstEnergy/Met-Ed!" Her roles included working in the Reading Business office (walk-in customers), revenue protection (theft of service) and revenue operations (collections).
